MONTREAL INTERNATIONAL MUSICAL COMPETITION, MAY 23 – JUNE 3 CANDIDATES, PROGRAMMING AND NEW ACTIVITIES

HIGHLIGHTS

- 24 candidates (8 women and 16 men). Average age: 25.
- Candidates from 12 different countries. 4 candidates from Canada including 1 from Quebec.
- Explore 24 individual portraits of the candidates, recorded around the world via *Skype*, at www.concoursmontreal.ca
- Spokesperson : for the fourth time, Simon Durivage, RDI news anchor.
- Total prizes and engagements: over \$150,000.
- For the winner of the First Prize: a \$30,000 cash prize, and a Career development program valued at \$20,000.
- Imposed Canadian Work: A Wild Innocence, by David L. McIntyre.
- The \$5,000 Radio-Canada People's Choice Award will be awarded during the gala evening on June 3. It is possible to vote online!
- Beginning on May 17, and over the course of each of the rounds, Espace musique, official broadcaster of the MIMC, and Espace classique internet radio will present unique coverage of the competition, both on the air and over the web at Radio-Canada.ca/cmim
- CBC Radio Two and Radio One are also offering coverage of the Competition as part of their programming.
- In addition to these live broadcasts, the Final round will be heard in several countries around the world through Radio-Canada's association with the European Broadcasting Union (EBU).
