

RECORD INCREASE IN APPLICATIONS FOR CMIM VIOLIN 2016 PRELIMINARY JURY BEGINS AUDITIONS

Montréal, January 19, 2016 – Over 200 violinists have applied to take part in the next edition of the Concours musical international de Montréal (CMIM), up 70% from last year's edition (Voice 2015) and the previous Violin edition in 2013. A total of 206 applications were submitted by 125 women and 81 men, with an average age of 23 years. 34 countries are represented, with the highest number of candidates from United States, South Korea, Canada, and Japan. Over the next few weeks, a preliminary jury of five specialists will review and rank all of the submissions, to select the 24 candidates who will be invited to compete in Montreal. This preliminary round will be judged by **Jonathan Crow, Boris Kuschnir, Douglas McNabney, Lucie Robert**, and **Andrew Wan**. The official list of candidates will be announced after this initial round.

The Competition will take place at Bourgie Concert Hall and Maison symphonique from May 22 to June 2 and the international jury presided by André Bourbeau, Co-Founder and President of the CMIM, includes: Pierre Amoyal (France); Boris Brott (Canada); Boris Garlitsky (Russia); Ida Kavafian (Armenia/United States); Mihaela Martin (Romania); Vera Tsu Wei-Ling (China); and Kathleen Winkler (United States).
