

#### **AYANA TSUJI TRIUMPHS AT THE CMIM 2016 VIOLIN EDITION**

**Montréal, Thursday, June 2, 2016** – The curtain came down tonight on the 15<sup>th</sup> edition of the Concours musical international de Montréal (CMIM). Right before the gala concert with the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal (OSM), CMIM officials publically announced the prizewinners of the 2016 violin edition at Maison symphonique to the audience in the hall and around the world, thanks to the live Webcast produced by the CMIM and streamed simultaneously on medici.tv.

The First Prize of \$30,000 went to 18-year old Japanese violinist Ayana Tsuji, who also won the André-Bachand Award, the best semifinal recital award, the best performance of a Sonata in a semifinal, as well as the Bach and Paganini awards. Here is the complete list of the prizewinners:

Accompanied by the OSM under guest conductor Giancarlo Guerrero, the three main prizewinners performed to an enthusiastic audience. Third Prize winner Minami Yoshida played the First Movement of Sibelius' Concerto in D minor, opus 47, followed by Second Prize winner Bomsori Kim, performing the third and fourth movements of Shostakovitch's Concerto No. 1 opus 99. First Prize winner Ayana Tsuji closed the concert in a complete performance of Sibelius' Concerto in D minor, opus 47. Marc Bouchkov, CMIM 2013 First Prize winner, offered a poignant performance of the theme from Schindler's List by composer John Williams.

#### **PIANO IN 2017**
