Dedicated to its mission of *making classical music accessible to as many people as possible*, the CMIM has also joined forces with the Atelier lyrique de l'Opéra de Montréal, the Conservatoire de musique de Montréal, McGill University's Schulich School of Music and the Université de Montréal to create these special events associated with the Voice 2022 edition.

The masterclasses are offered by members of the international jury of Voice 2022. These accomplished artists' knowledge and expertise is beyond doubt! True enthusiasts, these masters are all committed to passing on their passion to young singers in training.

- **Soprano Christine Schäfer** (Germany) is known for having one of the most acclaimed international opera, concert, recital and recording careers of her generation.
- Bass-Baritone Robert Holl (Netherlands) works with the most renowned conductors and orchestras in Europe, the United States and Japan. He is one of the most important Lieder singers of our time, with a particular interest in German and Russian repertoires.
- Soprano Adrianne Pieczonka (Canada) is acclaimed for her interpretations of Wagner, Strauss, Verdi and Puccini. She has performed on major stages including the Metropolitan Opera, Royal Opera House Covent Garden, La Scala Milan, Bavarian State Opera and Opéra Bastille.
- Baritone Sir Thomas Allen (United Kingdom) is an established star of the world's great opera houses. A Stage director, opera director and recitalist, he sang more than fifty roles at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden.

The CMIM is the only international competition in North America to be held annually and to feature three disciplines (piano, voice, and violin) in a three-year rotation. Since its first edition dedicated to Voice in 2002, 3,700 hopefuls have applied, and some 500 competitors have been welcomed to perform before enthusiastic audiences in Montreal.
