The Concours musical international de Montréal (CMIM) is a prestigious competition that showcases the international elite of the new generation of classical musicians. Founded in 2001 by André Bourbeau and Joseph Rouleau, the CMIM enjoys an undeniable reputation worldwide. Top-level artists come to Montreal from around the globe to participate. Since its beginnings, nearly 5,000 young musicians from more than 90 countries, trained at some of the most highly regarded schools in the world, have participated in the Concours.

The CMIM is an integral part of the Montreal arts scene. It upholds the city's reputation for cultural richness, openness to the world and a welcoming spirit. Proud of its heritage, the CMIM encourages interaction between the public and exceptional mentors in order to reveal and propel the young classical music talents of our time.

The CMIM aims to make classical music accessible to as many people as possible by way of live concerts and live streaming on the CMIM website. The CMIM editions have garnered over 1 million views from around the world.







The international jury for the Violin 2023 edition was led by renowned director and administrator Richard Rodzinski. Seven prestigious members made up the international jury: Koichiro Harada (Japan), Yura Lee (Korea/United States), Malcolm Lowe (Canada), Mihaela Martin (Romania), Lucie Robert (Canada), Dmitry Sitkovetsky (United Kingdom/United States) and Krishna Thiagarajan (Germany/United States).

The distinguished members of this international jury listened to and evaluated the performances of 24 of the most talented young violinists on the planet, after which they selected the laureates and winners of the special prizes for the Violin 2023 edition.


