

Piano 2024: Much more than a flurry of notes

The 22nd edition of the Concours musical international de Montréal brought us together around the piano from May 5 to 16, 2024.

Each year, the CMIM's reputation attracts the best artists of the new generation to Montreal. In 2024, a record number of 388 young pianists applied in the hope of competing in Montreal.

Following the preliminary selection, 24 candidates from 12 different countries (including one from Quebec and 3 other Canadians), were invited to compete.

The 24 competitors of Piano 2024, between the ages of 19 and 29, masterfully captured the hearts of the jury, the audience, and the media.








INCREASING NUMBERS

Box Office

The pianists of the Piano 2024 edition won the hearts of Montrealers and the CMIM audience. Nearly 5,000 people attended one or more of the Competition rounds, representing an attendance rate increase of over 49% compared to our 2023 edition, and a 65% increase in ticket revenue.




Online Views

With a strong digital presence, the CMIM reaches a broad international audience. Beyond Montreal's venues, viewers can experience each stage of the competition through various international platforms.

The CMIM Reaches All Age Groups

The CMIM recorded over 1.5 million online views in 2024, with 530,000 views coming from our own media (website, YouTube, and Vimeo) and nearly 1 million views from our international partners' platforms (Amadeus.tv and Violin Channel). These results represent a 25% increase compared to 2023.




SOCIAL MEDIA

THE JUNIOR JURY: A NEW INITIATIVE

This year, a Junior Jury became part of the CMIM adventure. Chaired by pianist and professor Janelle Fung, the jury was comprised nine advanced piano students from the Conservatoire de musique de Montréal (Joon Oh Kim, Kris Sossoulo, Tu Linh Vu); the Schulich School of Music at McGill University (Dane Ko, Mai Miyagaki, Veola Sun); and the Faculty of Music at the University of Montréal (Sara Sierra Jaramilla, Fabrizzio Vargas Saavedra, Fiona Wu).





The students listened to and evaluated the 24 competitors in the First Round. They chose to award the "Junior Jury Prize," valued at \$1,000, to Polish pianist Jakub Kuszlik.

This first experience with a Junior Jury provided an exceptional opportunity for young Montreal students to meet professionals in the field and discover international artists of the new generation.

Through this initiative, the CMIM demonstrates its commitment to working closely with Montreal institutions, while encouraging the presence of their students at the Competition's venues. The Junior Jury is an example of the importance the CMIM places on the educational aspect of the Competition.

PRESENTED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH DIXI LAMBERT AND THE MONTREAL CHAMBER MUSIC FESTIVAL

Chamber music made its debut at the CMIM in 2024. Each of the 10 semifinalists joined three of the principal chairs of the Orchestre symphonique de Montreal -- Andrew Wan (violin), Victor Fournelle-Blain (viola), and Brian Manker (cello) -- to perform a movement of a piano guartet.

- The CMIM Chamber Music Prize included a \$2,500 scholarship offered by Dixi Lambert. The prize winner, pianist Gabriele Strata, will return to Montreal to participate in a concert presented by the Montreal Chamber Music Festival, valued at \$3,500.
- The pianists were able to showcase several complementary skills to those already in evidence during the regular rounds.
- The jury observed the semifinalists' abilities to collaborate with other musicians, their sense of musical dialogue, their versatility, and their adaptability within an ensemble.
- The audience experienced the emotions of the competition in a new way, stepping beyond the usual CMIM framework.
- The CMIM continued to innovate by daring to renew its artistic offerings and by presenting the public with varied and exciting programs.

Imposed Canadian Work

For the Piano 2024 edition, the CMIM presented the world premiere of an imaginative new work for solo piano by Barbara Assiginaak, an Anishinaabe (Odawa, Ojibwe and Potawatomi; Mnidoo Mnissing, Giniw Dodem) composer who balances her time composing with performing and teaching music and engaging in land-based environmental activities and teaching work rooted in traditional Anishinaabek teachings.

Each competitor was required to include *Mzizaakok Miiniwaa Mzizaakoonsak* (Horseflies and Deerflies) in their Semifinal recital programme.

The international jury awarded the André-Bachand Prize for the Best performance of the imposed Canadian work, valued at \$2,500, to Jaeden Izik-Dzurko.

THE CMIM ENCOUNTERS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS


An initiative presented in partnership with the CDPQ and JM Canada

For Piano 2024, the CMIM ventured beyond the city's borders to offer an unprecedented musical experience with the launch of CMIM On the Road.

Thanks to strategic partnerships with presenters, the 14 pianists eliminated after the First Round of the Competition had the opportunity to meet other audiences and perform their programs prepared for the Semifinal.

This initiative invites music lovers to experience the magic of the CMIM by attending outstanding performances by young international pianists of the new generation in an intimate setting.

In 2024, the CMIM made stops in Hudson (Hudson Chamber Music Series), Nun's Island (Concerts sur le fleuve), and Sorel (La Maison de la musique de Sorel-Tracy).

- The non-qualifying competitors had the opportunity to perform their prepared programs for the Semifinal and extend their CMIM journey for a longer time.
- New audiences were able to hear CMIM competitors, the stars of the new generation, in a familiar and beloved venue.
- Our musical community is energized, particularly the collaborating presenters who were able to showcase exceptional artists to their audiences, artists they would not have been able to present without the help of the CMIM.
- The CMIM was able to expand its reach by connecting with audiences outside of Montreal, while encouraging potential future visits to the Maison symphonique for the Final.
- And all of us, by implementing eco-friendly practices, have optimized the travel of participants from abroad.

News from Our Laureates

OUR LAUREATES ON THE WORLD STAGE

Jaeden Izik-Dzurko

Following recent performances in Poland, Spain, and Italy, where he performed alongside Canadian star pianist Angela Hewitt, Jaeden returns to Canada to open the Edmonton Symphony season with Rachmaninoff's *Piano Concerto No. 3*. Winner of the *Steinway Prizewinners tour*, awarded in May in Montreal, Jaeden will be on tour in South Korea next spring. Jaeden was awarded another First Prize in September 2024 at the Leeds International Piano Competition in Britain.

Dmytro Udovychenko

Fans in Montreal were thrilled when Dmytro, Grand laureate of CMIM Violon 2023, also won first prize at the Queen Élisabeth violin competition in Brussels in June. The 25-year-old Ukrainian triumphed with the Shostakovich *Concerto No.1*, the same work he performed in the Final with the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal conducted by Rafael Payare. Dmytro has upcoming concerts in Germany, Belgium, and Japan, and will have the chance to play a 1708 Stradivarius for the next four years. He also had the opportunity to purchase a new bow, made in Paris in 1915, with the help of his Joseph Rouleau Career Development Grant, offered by the Azrieli Foundation.

Simone McIntosh and Meredith Wohlgemuth

Now based in Paris, the Canadian mezzo-soprano, winner of the 1st prize for Voice 2022-Aria, was recently heard in *Die Walküre* and *Orfeo* at the Zurich Opera. In the coming season she will perform at the San Francisco Opera in *The Handmaid's Tale*, then makes her debut at Hannover Opera where she will star opposite soprano Meredith Wohlgemuth, winner of the 1st prize for Voice 2022-Art Song. Both will star in Bellini's beautiful *Romeo and Juliet*. Meredith continues her residency at this prestigious German opera house, where her lead roles for the season also include Sophie in *Der Rosenkavalier* and Titania in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

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
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
