By taking part in the CMIM, the competitors face their peers and express their art before a jury composed of international luminaries in their discipline, and are heard by the Montréal public and music lovers online.

VOICE 2025 EDITION

An Extraordinary Human and Musical Adventure

From May 25 to June 6, 2025, the 23rd edition of the Concours musical international de Montréal allowed us to hear some of the most beautiful voices of the new generation. Emotions were high throughout!

This year, despite very challenging application criteria, a total of 348 singers from 43 countries applied for Voice 2025 to measure themselves against their peers. Following careful evaluation by our preliminary jury, 24 competitors from 16 countries earned their place on this prestigious musical journey.

These accomplished singers, ranging from 25 to 32 years old, brought their artistry, versatility, and musicality to the Montréal public, who warmly applicated them after each performance at Salle Bourgie and Maison symphonique.



The Concours in the News

Over the last year, the CMIM has been the subject of more than 150 media impressions, including radio, television, print, and online media outlets.

Four sessions of the Voice 2025 edition were broadcast live and then re-aired on the program *Toute une musique* hosted by Marie-Christine Trottier on ICI Musique Classique, along with exclusive interviews and commentary.

OUR JURYS

The International Jury

The task of the International Jury was to evaluate the various performances of the Voice 2025 competition. Composed of international experts with diverse backgrounds, the jury benefitted from the strengths and knowledge of each of its members to rigorously and impartially assess the competitors' technique, interpretation, musicality, and overall artistry.

In accordance with a new positive scoring method – called "approval voting" – put in place by the CMIM for this edition, the International Jury selected the laureates of Voice 2025 based on the cumulative results obtained in all the rounds.

By evaluating the performances, the jury plays a key role in the Concours. It also contributes to the development of these young artists' careers by offering valuable feedback and advice, as well as new professional contacts in the music industry.

Since 2012, the Orchestre symphonique de Montréal (OSM) has been the official orchestra of the CMIM. Each edition, the competitors have the privilege of performing alongside this world-class orchestra at Maison symphonique de Montréal for the final stages of the competition.

Patrick Summers, Guest Conductor

Conductor Patrick Summers directed the OSM for Voice 2025. Patrick Summers has appeared with some of the most prestigious opera companies around the world, conducting a wide range of repertoire. A leading proponent of contemporary American opera, he is Artistic and Music Director of the Houston Grand Opera and has been Co-Director of Aspen Music School's opera program for young artists, alongside Renée Fleming, since 2019.

Carson Becke, Martin Dubé, Esther Gonthier, and Ian Tindale served as the Official Pianists of Voice 2025, performing alongside the competitors throughout the First Round, as well as the Art Song Prize Final, of Voice 2025.

JUNIOR JURY

For the second consecutive year, the CMIM invited students from Montréal's music education institutions to take part in a Junior Jury. The six members of this jury were present during all the sessions of the First Round to evaluate the performances of the competitors and to determine the winner of a special prize.

This highly formative experience enabled the students to view a major competition from the inside and to familiarize themselves with the work of a jury member, while developing their own critical faculties.

With its Junior Jury, the CMIM continues to pursue new initiatives to strengthen its importance in Montréal, developing and maintaining partnerships while cultivating privileged relationships with local institutions and key players in the music community.

Masterclasses

The CMIM benefitted from the presence of leading artists in Montréal to organise public masterclasses for local students. Baritone Étienne Dupuis, pianist lain Burnside, and soprano Harolyn Blackwell offered precious advice and guidance to young artists.



CANADIAN AND CONTEMPORARY WORKS

The CMIM took advantage of Voice 2025's international platform to champion the work of composers from Quebec and Canada.

In collaboration with composers and institutions from Quebec and elsewhere in Canada, the CMIM created a resource of contemporary arias composed after 1975 from which the competitors could draw inspiration while creating their musical programs.

Thanks to this initiative, more than fifteen works from the *québécois* and Canadian repertoire were heard during Voice 2025, highlighting the music of 10 of our own composers.



We are grateful to the iconic author, composer, and singer Robert Charlebois for allowing us to borrow the title of his famous song, which we happily hum each time this valuable grant helps a CMIM winner return to Montréal.

All three laureates of the Piano 2024 edition – **Jaeden Izik-Dzurko**, **Gabriele Strata, and Anthony Ratinov** – returned to Montréal to perform in the 2024-25 season.





Harriet Burns (Voice 2022), Julien Van Mellaerts (Voice 2018), and pianist Ian Tindale (Voice 2022) returned to Montréal in June to present a recital devoted to Schubert's lieder. This concert gave us a wonderful opportunity to bring together our CMIM audience with that of Salle Bourgie.
